


Redeployed Colleagues The Inside View is launching a new column called "Letters from Home" to





The Research Roundup **Congratulations to Our 2020 Minigrant Recipients** The Radiology Research Steering Committee is pleased to announce that Salil Soman, MD, has been awarded a Radiology Research Minigrant for his proposed study with specific aims to: 1) compare Cerebral microbleed (CMB) detection rates on precondition quantitative susceptibility mapping (pQSM), and susceptibility-weighted imaging (SWI)/SWI Phase Map Imaging of patients with known recent intracranial hemorrhage (ICH), and evaluate how often the number and/or location of detected CMBs would change patient characterization. 2) compare the ability of pQSM and SWI/SWI P to differentiate intracranial calcifications from CMBs.
